About School-Based Health Care

Students perform better when they show up for class, healthy and ready to learn. School-based health centers (SBHCs) bring the doctor's office to the school so students avoid health-related absences and get support needed to succeed in the classroom. It is therefore important for parents to know what SBHCs are, the services they offer, and the benefits their children can receive through enrollment.



School-Based Health Centers:

- Are located in schools or on school grounds.
- Work cooperatively with the school to become an integral part of its services.
- Provide a comprehensive range of services that meet the specific health needs of the young people in the community.
- Employ a multi-disciplinary team of providers, as needed, to care for the students: nurse practitioners, registered nurses, physician assistants, social workers, physicians, alcohol and drug abuse counselors and other health professionals.
- Provide clinical services to students enrolled in the SBHC through a qualified health provider, like Valley Health.
- Require parents to sign written consents for their children to receive the SBHC's full scope of services.
- Allow parents to receive follow-up information when their child receives services from the SBHC.

Payment Options

At Valley Health, we are committed to providing quality healthcare to every child, regardless of his or her family's ability to pay. Payment options include private insurance, Medicaid, CHIPs and payment programs for those without insurance. Families with private insurance may also qualify for some programs to assist with the cost of care. Information about various programs and how to apply is available from our SBHC staff. Students with a registration and insurance on file at the health center will be eligible to have insurance billed when service is rendered.

Additional Services & Locations

Valley Health is an integrated network of over 30 primary healthcare centers and public health programs in West Virginia and Ohio. Services include family medicine, dentistry, OB/GYN, WIC, pediatrics, internal medicine, behavioral health, optometry, pharmacy, x-ray/ultrasound and lab.
